



## **Katrina/Rita Affordable Housing Rehabilitation and New Construction Training**

**NeighborWorks® America will provide training for organizations  
and government agencies working to rebuild affordable  
single family housing in Katrina/Rita impacted areas.**

NeighborWorks® America, in its response to the disasters brought on by the summer hurricanes, has planned a three-day training event, in New Orleans: one half day on March 28, a full day on March 29, and a half day on March 30.

These three eight-hour courses are designed for organizations and local government agencies with a track record of renovating existing affordable single family housing or building new affordable single family housing. Courses will assist organizations and agencies in increasing their capacity and systems in order to better serve communities impacted by Katrina/Rita. The three courses offered are:

-  **Increasing Rehabilitation and New Construction Production and Capacity:** Best practices and innovative solutions in the industry, streamlining project management, improving project feasibility, software solutions, and the elements of business planning for owner-occupied housing rehabilitation, acquisition/rehabilitation and single family production lines.
-  **Environmental and Healthy Housing Issues:** Mold abatement, hazardous materials problems, healthy homes, green building, and software solutions.
-  **Business and Resource Solutions:** Managing rapid business line growth, making business line decisions, resource development, resource allocation strategies and quantifying impacts

The three eight hour classes will run simultaneously. This will allow each participant to attend the two highest priority sessions of their choice. Organizations are encouraged to send two participants in order to benefit from all three classes.

**For applicants who are selected,** air travel and lodging for March 28 and 29 at the designated hotel will be paid for by NeighborWorks® America. Participants will be responsible for meals, local travel, parking and all other incidentals. Subsequent to approval, each applicant will receive a registration packet. In lieu of a registration fee, participants will be required to make a \$50 donation payable to the Neighborhood Housing Services of New Orleans, a member of the NeighborWorks® America Network.
